

Program of Study

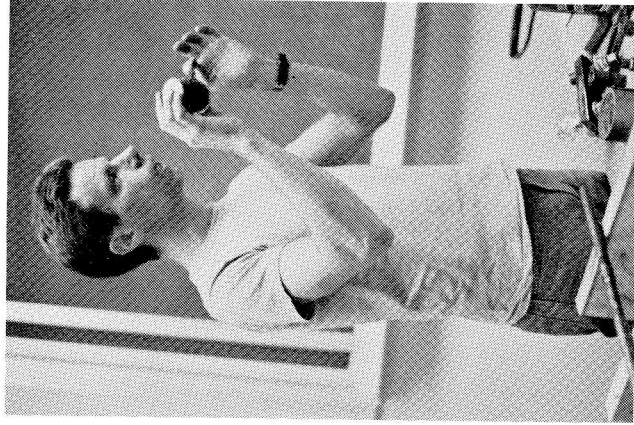
The School of Environmental and Vocational Arts (SEVA), founded in 1982, is a non-degree-awarding center of learning. As a nonprofit educational center, SEVA offers courses during three nine-week trimesters commencing in April and ending in November. From December through March, SEVA recesses for the cold upstate New York winter months.

Registered students of SEVA are trained in practical skills of the following major program areas: Agriculture, Integrated Architecture, Energy Resource Development, and Health Enrichment.

Lectures & Seminars

Each trimester, lectures, classes, seminars and workshops are offered in the four major program areas, along with supplemental courses of special interest and educational value that fall outside of the major subject areas. The description, time and location of these offerings can be found

Internship Programs

The Internship programs last nine weeks and consist of one hundred hours of hands-on field experience, research and study, and lecture and class-
